- Students will be able to use their knowledge of Spanish language and culture to understand literature and interpret art outside of the classroom.
- Students will be able to identify key struggles that immigrants face coming into our country as well as list specific reasons as to why each side of the illegal immigration debate feels the way they do.
- Students will be able to explain how news coverage is different between the United States and will be able find relevant information on current events in other countries.
